The lecture will explore how a human rights approach could assist in the translation of 'digital work' to 'decent work'. A human rights approach is appealing as a way in which to overcome the employment status problem, but also to recognise the universal character of the relevance of the digital in working lives. The pros and cons of a regulatory strategy which relies on human rights protections will be presented, as regards access to such issues as algorithmic management and design utilisation of artificial intelligence (AI), while also considering the effects of changes to location of the workplace. The limitations of strategic human rights litigation will be analysed, together with the need for them to be must be complemented by other forms of mobilisation to be effective.
